


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The Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy...




- A unique bottom-up movement launched by the European Commission, shaped by cities, for cities
- A shared vision of decarbonised and resilient cities where citizens have access to secure, sustainable and affordable energy
- A growing and inclusive community now counting almost 7,800 signatories representing over 250 million citizens

Commitments of EaP signatory cities

If the CoM signatory cities would <u>NOT</u> commit and take actions... they would need to:

or plant 850 millions of trees stop using 12 millions of new cars

replace 630 millions of old IL lamps with new LED lamps

... in order to absorb these unsaved CO₂ emissions!

Monitoring & Reporting

Commitments of a CoM Signatory



- Set up relevant administrative structures to design and implement overall energy and climate policy
- Develop a local Sustainable Energy & Climate Action Plan (SECAP)
- Involve citizens and other stakeholders to develop and implement SECAPs
- Publish periodic reports to show concrete progress and results of SECAP implementation
- Encourage other cities to join the initiative

CoM East 2016 – 2020: Overview

5 strategic pillars:

✓ Reinforce decentralisation and local ownership of the Covenant

- ✓ Make the Covenant go more national
- ✓ Inscribe energy and climate in national policies and strategies
- ✓Build capacity and mobilize funds
- Team work and international networking

5 main activities:

- ✓Capacity building
 ✓Helpdesk
- Networking and cooperation with key stakeholders
- ✓Communication
 ✓Coordination

3 main expected results:
 ✓ Local energy policies and SECAPs are designed
 ✓ First SECAPs are implemented and monitored
 ✓ Covenant has been embedded at the national level

Networking and cooperation

Coordinate the participation of LAs and key stakeholders in international networking events

- Facilitate exchange of experience and know-how between EU / EaP countries
- Coordinate with other EU programmes to avoid overlaps and create synergies
- Liaise with IFIs and donors



Create permanent networking platforms at country level

 Bringing together LAs and the actors* with the power and capacity to support them in designing, implementing and funding their SEAPs/SECAPs

*Includes CNC, CTC, CS, public authorities, financing institutions, donors, private sector, associations, EU Delegations, etc.

✓ Will ensure sustainability as they will embed the CoM in nat. frameworks

Municipal Development and Coordination Platform (MDCP)



Why? To create the conditions for a more effective CoM implementation at national and subnational level

Who? All CoM stakeholders: ministries, signatory cities, EU delegations, IFIs and donors, Covenant supporters, business sector, residential associations, NGOs, civil society, etc.

How?

✓By gathering all stakeholders in a multichannel horizontal information exchange platform and by coordinating their activities

✓By creating favourable conditions for the identification of barriers and possible solutions




Covenant of Mayors – Demonstration projects (CoM DeP)
